As Chairman of ACAG, Peter has continually fought to preserve the unique character of our village by opposing unnecessary and undesirable development.

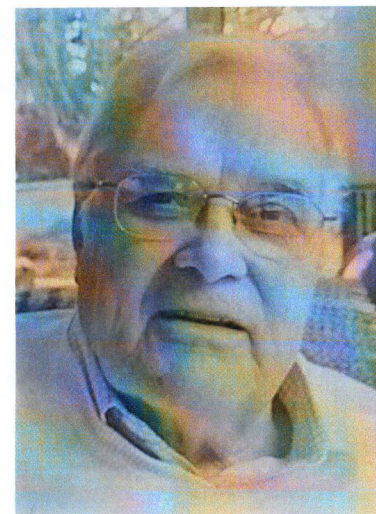
HOW IS PETER VIEWED IN THE COMMUNITY?
