## TRAFFIC CONSULTATION RESULTS

---

**Residents of West Adderbury have become increasingly concerned by the speed and volume of traffic through the village. Traffic entering the village via Milton Rd into Horn Hill Road then onto Cross Hill Road has seen an increase of 141% since 2012.**

The **West Adderbury Residents' Association (WARA)** was asked by its members to take the matter up with Adderbury Parish Council (APC) which had formed a committee to look into methods of traffic calming and then **promptly ignored** their own committee's recommendations of:

- **Reducing speed limits throughout the village to 20 mph (apart from the two trunk roads, the A4260 and the A4100)**
- **This would be enforced by the use of speed calming and build outs. The cost would be around £170,000**

The committee suggested ways in which this could be funded. Adderbury currently has funds of over £600,000 from section 106 agreements provided by developers who have built houses in the village.

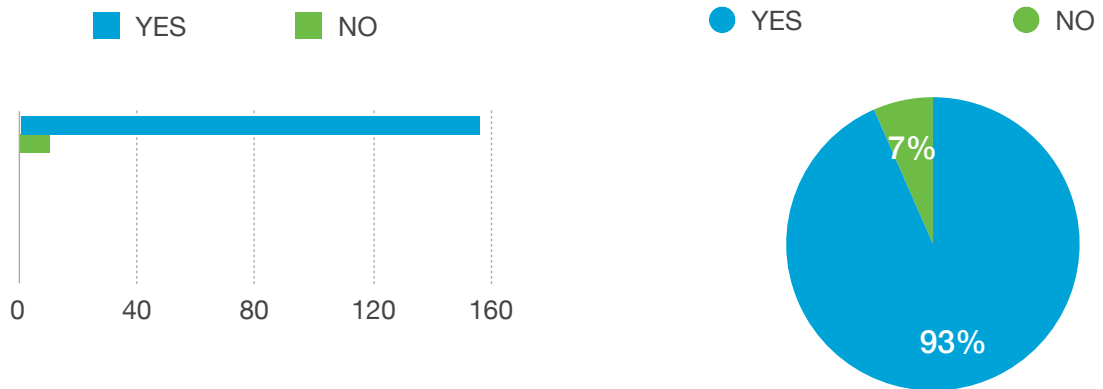
Another funding alternative would be for the village to apply for a public works loan to carry out the work which would be paid back over a period of time by a small increase on the village precept, at an average of around £10 per annum per household.

In light of APC's attitude towards this critical issue WARA decided to carry out a consultation of all of West Adderbury's residents to prove the depth of feeling on this subject.

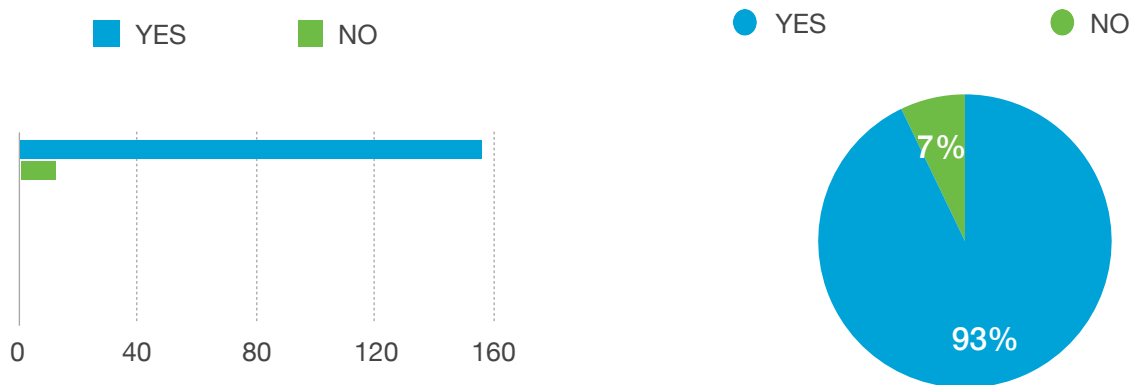
- **403 households were contacted during December /January**
- **We had 169 responses: 42% of all households in West Adderbury**
- **93% of residents want active measures taken to combat traffic speed**
- **87% want Section 106 funds used to pay for traffic calming**

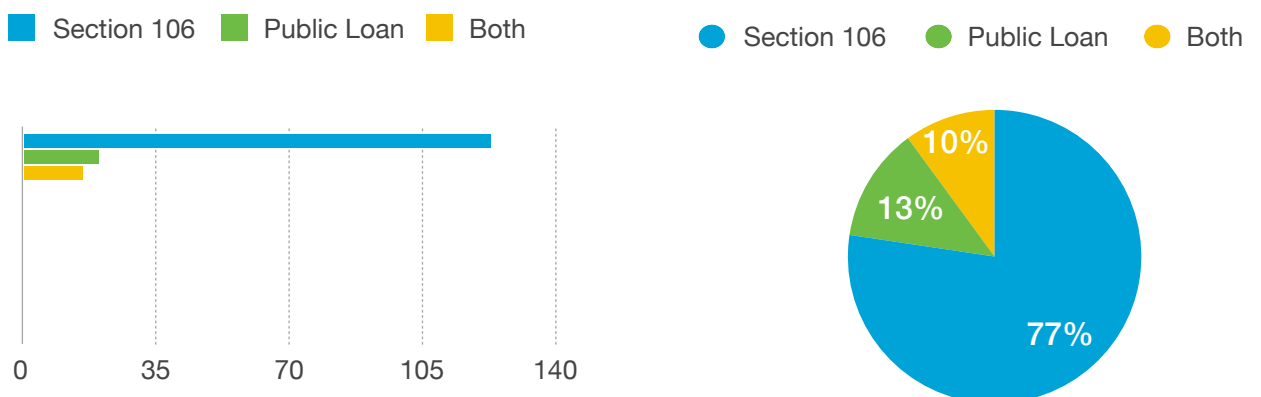
Q1: Is speeding a problem in West Adderbury?

Q1: Is speeding a problem in West Adderbury?

Q2: Would you like to see active measures to combat speeding traffic such as reduced speed limits, build-out chicanes, road humps, speed cushions or reduced traffic flow at the Oak Tree Green?

Q3: If you believe that action needs to be taken, how would you like it funded? The Parish Council currently has £600k available from existing Section 106 funds. An alternative would be for the Parish Council to obtain a public works loan that is estimated to add £10 to everyone's council tax bill.
